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Bellanca Champion Citabria 7eca 7gcaa

The model 7ECA Citabria entered production at Champion in 1964. The 7GCAA and 7GCBC variants, added in 1965, were joined by the 7KCAB in 1968. In 1970, Champion was acquired by Bellanca Aircraft Corporation, which continued production of all of the Champion-designed variants.

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Champion Aircraft 7ECA Citabria, Single-engine two-seat ...

The Champion 7ECA Citabria was a modernized version of the Champion Model 7EC Traveler. Champion's first Citabria flew as a prototype in May 1964. Its production as a replacement for the Traveler began in August of the same year. The Champion two seat aircraft was powered by a 108hp Continental fourcylinder engine.

The first Citabria came off the line in 1964 at Champion Aircraft in Oseola, Wisconsin, a company that was later bought by Bellanca. Eventually, the Citabria line expanded to four models. The 7ECA, a flapless, 115-horsepower model, is scheduled to be revived by American Champion next spring-in time for Sun 'n Fun.

On acquiring the design, Bellanca gave this model the name Citabria "Standard" and began using the 115 horsepower (86 kW) Lycoming O-235-K2C engine. When American Champion reintroduced the 7ECA in 1995 as the Citabria "Aurora, " the biggest change was the use of metal-spar wings; the most recent significant design change has been the switch to aluminum main gear legs in 2004.

Champion Aircraft would eventually produce the 7ECA Citabria (that's "Airbatic" spelled backwards) and its 7GCAA and 7GCBC variants, as well as the 7KCAB. In 1970, Bellanca Aircraft acquired Champion Aircraft and would later introduce the 8KCAB Decathlon and 8GCBC Scout.

Robert Szego, president of the Bellanca-Champion Club in Coxsackie, New York, had his similar 7GCAA rebuilt and insures it for a value of \$60,000. It is nearly identical to the 7GCBC except it has no flaps. His goes about 100 mph at 75-percent power, just like the 7GCBC. You have to get it inspected before you buy, Szego said.

• 7ECA— Introduced in 1964 as an aerobatic follow-on to the Champ. Originally, it had a 100-HP Continental O-200, soon replaced by the 115-HP Lycoming O-235. It is in production as the 7ECA Citabria Aurora.

The American Champion 7GCA is the agricultural version of the 7GC with a higher powered Lycoming O-320-A2B engine. The 7GCBC, the 7GCBC Explorer, and the 7GCBC High Country Explorer are also part of the GC series. The final variant produced was the American Champion 7ACA. It more closely resembles the American Champion 7GCAA Citabria series.
