He began writing Fear in 1925 but did not publish it until 1930, a year after his first novel, *Durand: voyageur de commerce*, was released. Fear was suppressed during World War II and not made available again until 1951, by which time Chevallier had earned international fame for his *Clochemerle* (1934), a comedy of provincial French manners of the Beaujolais region that sold several million copies.
